Our JV runners continue to amaze the coaches and should feel really proud of their terrific displays.

Next up were the JV boys who once again were in fantastic form. The JV men packed superbly as Adam Kinalski led the Knight charge with a 5<sup>th</sup> placing and Ben Fujii excelled in 10<sup>th</sup>. Jimmy Harrison, who might be our most improved JV runner, was outstanding in 19<sup>th</sup>, followed closely by Zach Klein in 31<sup>st</sup>, Matt Burke 34<sup>th</sup> and a much improved effort by Jon Burlile in 38<sup>th</sup>. Braden Kyle ran strongly in 48<sup>th</sup> and Neal Maguire impressed in 51<sup>st</sup>. The Knights put 7 girls in the top 14 as defending state champ, Emily Nist, was outstanding again and led home a 1-2 finish with Lara Tuthill, terrific in the runner-up position. A very gallant effort was put forth by Rebecca Lassere in 7<sup>th</sup>, and what was most exciting was the close packing of Briana Tiffany, Erin Kelly, Camille Fery and Erin Gordon. These girls finished 11<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> with a gap of 16 seconds. It was an excellent display by these wonderful ladies to pack so tightly in the quality field.

Switching to the varsity boys, Dan Williams was once again at his tremendous best running away from the top class field to record a superb victory. Conor Harris was very gutsy in 11<sup>th</sup>, while Andrew Chumich continued his stellar season with another great outing in 21<sup>st</sup>. Senior Gabe Leis and D.J. Corisis rounded out the top 5 with impressive efforts in 27<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. And with 5 runners in the top 30, the Knights had done enough to annex the crown over a very strong Borah team. Matt Goodwin ran the race of his life and a huge PR to finish 35<sup>th</sup>, and Joe Cardona making his first varsity appearance had an excellent showing in 39<sup>th</sup>.

### **If Your Child is Absent from School:**

If your student is not coming to school due to illness or an appointment, parents are required to call the school's Attendance Office by 9:30 am, 377-9928. Parents may also e-mail or fax notes to Mrs. Lisa Kelly for excused absences at [lkelly@bk.org](mailto:lkelly@bk.org). The BK fax is 375-3626. If your child is going to be absent from school for an extended amount of time, please contact the attendance office as soon as possible **prior** to the absence. Pre-arranged absence forms are available from Mr. Coulter for Juniors/Seniors and Mrs. Quilici for Freshman/Sophomores. These will allow students to notify teachers and to receive homework assignments before the absence. Note: Students leaving school for professional appointments must notify the Attendance Office **before** school, when they leave, and again when they return. They will be asked for verification of that appointment upon returning to school. \*\*\*All students are required to sign in and out when coming late or leaving early.

### **How Can I Access My Child's Grades?**

You can access your student's grades and other information on the Internet. You need your student's ID number and PIN number. Your child's PIN and ID are located on the class schedule they received the first day of school. The PIN number is assigned throughout our Schoolmaster Program. It's important to keep this number confidential. If you would like to get your student's PIN number, please e-mail [administrator@bk.org](mailto:administrator@bk.org) with the student's full name. Go to the BK web page at [www.bk.org](http://www.bk.org) and access Schoolmaster; use your

student's ID number and PIN, and you will have his/her grades and records. Our teachers upgrade their records regularly, but not nightly. To access current grades on Schoolmaster, please follow these instructions.

1. Go to the Bishop Kelly website, [www.bk.org](http://www.bk.org).
2. Select **Schoolmaster** from the menu choices.
3. Enter your student's ID and PIN numbers in the appropriate boxes.
4. Click **Current Marks** in the list of choices.
5. If you want to see a progress report and more detailed information, follow steps 1, 2 and 3, then select **Schedule/Progress** from the list of choices. Teachers update these marks approximately every two weeks. Some teachers may update more frequently than others.

I have read the information about the flu vaccine. To the best of my knowledge, my child is not pregnant, has not had an allergic reaction to this vaccine, and has not previously been vaccinated against the flu this season.

I understand the benefits and risks of receiving the vaccine and assume full and complete responsibility for any liability that may arise as a result of the administration of the vaccine. I request that the flu vaccination be administered to my child, and I release and indemnify the Roman Catholic Diocese of Boise and Bishop Kelly High School from any claims arising as a result of the administration of the vaccine to my child.

I give permission to **enroll** my child and to transfer my child's immunization records into the statewide **Idaho Immunization Reminder Information System (IRIS)** to ensure that this vaccination record is available to me, my child's health care providers, child care providers and schools. I understand I may be asked for information that will help ensure my child's records are accurate and will not be confused with another person's records; such as, mother's maiden name, telephone number, gender, and child's eligibility for free vaccine.
