**Cross Country** – Congratulations to the BK cross country teams on their excellent displays of cross country running at the Bob Firman Invitational held at Eagle Island State Park on Saturday. Run as a regional cross country showcase, the varsity girls were first into action at 11 a.m. Super sophomore and defending state champ, Emily Nist's, athletic prowess was once again on display with a marvelous execution of cross country tactics. Taking a top 5 placing from the start, Nist and Eagle Standout senior, Liz Brandon, broke away early from the top class field to turn the 5 km trip into a spectacular duel. Not giving an inch and having the guts to surge to the lead in such a high powered quality race was a testament to Nist's mental toughness and racing

abilities. In the end, it was Brandon by 5 seconds over a very gallant Nist effort. Wonderful individual performances were turned in by Rebecca Lassere and captain Lara Tuthill who ran very courageously to capture 19<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> place respectively. Tuthill's time was over one minute faster than a year ago. Despite being sick early in the week, Camille Fery showed the guts and attitude of a true champion with a brilliant display of courage to finish 45<sup>th</sup> in the top class field. Briana Tiffany had her finest ever cross country finish in a Knight uniform to annex 49<sup>th</sup>. Amanda Thompson ran magnificently and really turned on the gas in the later portion of a very testing cross country challenge. Closing out the team for the knights was Erin Gordon who ran on very gamely to finish 69<sup>th</sup>. The Knights spearheaded an assault by Idaho teams who placed eleven runners in the top 25 of a race that featured some of the top runners from seven western states. In a very tight and congested team battle, the Knights carried the Idaho flag with pride to finish 3<sup>rd</sup>, only bettered by 2 of the best teams out of the state of Utah.

Switching to the varsity boys, Travis Milburn was outstanding in 11<sup>th</sup> place and chopped over a minute and 20 seconds off his time from a year ago. In fact, the Knights had their first 4 runners all under the time our 1<sup>st</sup> place finisher recorded a year ago. Despite not having his best day, Dan Williams excelled in 29<sup>th</sup> place and can take huge consolation in the fact that last year he ran 19:02 in the freshman's boys race, to yesterday's 16:40, a magnificent achievement on any scale. Watch out for Andrew Chumich. He went by bodies of runners in chunks over the last 1 km to be the 3<sup>rd</sup> Knight home and annex 63<sup>rd</sup>. Gabe Leis will no doubt have a better day and ran his heart out in 69<sup>th</sup>; and while being sick, Conor Harris fought every inch of the way to capture 82<sup>nd</sup>. Rounding out the knight's team were D.J. Corisis and Matt Goodwin. Both young men had vast improvements from a year ago and are wonderful additions to the Knight's depth chart. It's all about the last two weeks in October young men. That's when the hardware is given out and this coaching staff has every confidence that the road to a championship for the opposition will still have to go through the Bishop Kelly Knights.

Our JV squads continue to impress and have a marvelous season. They have been a model of consistency all season and Saturday was no different. Ashlynn Curnow and Erin Kelly were outstanding and cruised through the 5 km trip to annex a brilliant 1-2 finish. It was a delight to see Ashlynn and Erin take the race on and dominate in tremendous fashion. Next home for the Knights and having an amazing effort was Jillian Petterborg in 48<sup>th</sup>, Christina Gado 49<sup>th</sup>, and Julie Carnosso with a supreme effort in 68<sup>th</sup>. Great improvements were shown by Austyn Foss 84<sup>th</sup>, Reid Frechette 85<sup>th</sup>, Joan Cleary 94<sup>th</sup>, Lauren Letsinger 108<sup>th</sup>, Isana Urquidi 114<sup>th</sup>, Hannah Rollinger 115<sup>th</sup>, Anna Kinalski 122<sup>nd</sup>, Mariana Osuna 135<sup>th</sup>, Jessica Lukasik 155<sup>th</sup>, Cydney Middleton 157<sup>th</sup>, Juliana Riener 163<sup>rd</sup>, and Kelsey Hanna in 172<sup>nd</sup>. And finally, we had 3 girls in the freshman race and all excelled with great displays. Bailey Russell ran her heart out to finish 34<sup>th</sup>, Leslie Kelly likewise in 45<sup>th</sup> and Amanda Loewen extremely courageous one spot back in 46<sup>th</sup>.

### **If Your Child is Absent from School:**

If your student is not coming to school due to illness or an appointment, parents are required to call the school's Attendance Office by 9:30 am, 377-9928. Parents may also e-mail or fax notes to Mrs. Lisa Kelly for excused absences at [lkelly@bk.org](mailto:lkelly@bk.org). The BK fax is 375-3626. If your child is going to be absent from school for an extended amount of time, please contact the attendance office as soon as possible prior to the absence. Pre-arranged absence forms are available from Mr. Coulter for Juniors/Seniors and Mrs. Quilici for Freshman/Sophomores. These will allow students to notify teachers and to receive homework assignments before the absence. Note: Students leaving school for professional appointments must notify the Attendance Office **before** school, when they leave, and again when they return. They will be asked for verification of that appointment upon returning to school. \*\*\*All students are required to sign in and out when coming late or leaving early.

### **How Can I Access My Child's Grades?**

You can access your student's grades and other information on the Internet. You need your student's ID number and PIN number. Your child's PIN and ID are located on the class schedule they received the first day of school. The PIN number is assigned throughout our Schoolmaster Program. It's important to keep this number confidential. If you would like to get your student's PIN number, please e-mail [administrator@bk.org](mailto:administrator@bk.org) with the student's full name. Go to the BK web page at [www.bk.org](http://www.bk.org) and access Schoolmaster; use your student's ID number and PIN, and you will have his/her grades and records. Our teachers upgrade their records regularly, but not nightly. To access current grades on Schoolmaster, please follow these instructions.

1. Go to the Bishop Kelly website, [www.bk.org](http://www.bk.org).
2. Select **Schoolmaster** from the menu choices.
3. Enter your student's ID and PIN numbers in the appropriate boxes.
4. Click **Current Marks** in the list of choices.

5. If you want to see a progress report and more detailed information, follow steps 1, 2 and 3, then select **Schedule/Progress** from the list of choices. Teachers update these marks approximately every two weeks. Some teachers may update more frequently than others.
